Posted Procedure for Computer Usage

Patrons are required to sign in for use of library computers and furnish a valid library card. Patron sign-in represents full agreement with the policies and procedures concerning computer services as posted in the Library.

Patrons who do not have a valid library card from any library in The Library Network may purchase a guest pass to use the computers for the day.

Minor children and young adults ages 12-17 are required to present a valid library card at the time of sign-in. The Library will not accept any other form of identification from minors.

Children under the age of 12 will be accompanied by a parent/guardian on the computer with them to utilize the Library's computer services. Minors cannot use a guest card.

The library will not look up a patrons library card number if forgotten.

Patrons are limited to 2 hours per day of computer time.

Office software users are able to purchase USB drives from the Library at a nominal charge.

Printing from the Library's computers is available at a posted charge. This charge represents costs associated for paper and toner cartridges as provided by the Library.

Getting a Library Card

Patrons over the age of 18 must present one of the following to obtain a card:

A driver's license with a current address
Tax bill, mortgage papers or a lease agreement
with the new address

Patron under the age of 18 must have a parent or legal guardian to apply for borrowing privileges.

With your library card you will have borrowing privileges of most circulating materials in the library.

Your library card will also give you access to the Internet, Microsoft Word, Excel and Power Point.

The library has a separate computer policy for using our public computers. When signing on to the computer you will be prompted to read and accept the policy.

Children under the age of 12 will not be allowed to use the computer without adult supervision the entire time.

Children over 12 will have access to the filtered youth computers with parent/legal guardians consent.

Must live in one of the following communities: Trenton , Woodhaven, Brownstown, Gibraltar or Grosse Ile.

You cannot use another persons library card, each patron will be issued their own card.

Your default pin is either : 1234 or changeme



Your library's download service is available at the Download Destination website. It is a service of your public library and hosted by OverDrive.

Your library has selected a collection of popular titles in digital formats that are available anytime, anywhere.

You can Browse, Check out and Download popular audiobooks, eBooks, music from Download Destination – a 'Virtual Branch' website that includes many of the same services of a regular branch!

What you need to get started!

An Internet-connected computer.

A valid library card.

Free software available via the Download Destination website (OverDrive Media Console and other software for eBooks).



OverDrive



1. Browse the digital catalog on the Download Destination website. tln.lib.overdrive.com
2. You may also search by title, subject, author, format and other criteria. Convenient categories are also accessible from each page

Step 2 : Check Out

1. Add selections to your 'Cart'. Note: if a title is not available, you may place a hold. You will receive an email when the title is available for checkout.
2. Click on the 'Proceed to Checkout' link and enter your library card number.

Step 3 :Download and Enjoy!

1. Click on the 'Download' button under each title to launch OverDrive Media Console (for audiobooks and music), or other software for eBooks.*
2. Select parts to download (for audiobooks and music), then click 'OK'. The download will begin.
3. Once downloaded, titles may be enjoyed on your computer and transferred to a supported portable device!
